Membership

During the current year (2022) the present membership of AFST(I) stands at 4643 of which 3925 are life members (including Fellow).

Credential Committee: The Credential committee met nine times during the year to scrutinize the applications received. This year about 930 new applications for various categories of membership (about 257 Life Membership). Due to life membership offer, there was a remarkable increase in the number of life membership applications this year also, and the Credential committee did a wonderful job in expediting the clearance of the application forms.

Life membership drive: Based on the repeated requests from various chapters and members, the CEC advised to take up a Life Membership drive during the current year which was launched. The life membership offer was made available from 18th October 2022 to 30th November 2022. The information about the membership drive was hosted on the AFST(I) website for wider dissemination of the information.

Finance committee: The Finance committee met two times during the year to discuss about the Budget and Financial Status of the AFST(I). The important suggestions are mentioned as below:

• The committee gone through the estimate budget of AFST(I) and AFST(I) Education & Publication Trust for the Financial Year 2022.

- Committee suggested exploring possibilities of shifting fixed deposits to other bank where the interest rate is more.
- It was suggested to utilize the funds under website head to make a platform to scrutinize the applications digitally instead of taking print.
- It was approved to provide 2 sets of uniforms and 1 pair of shoes for the staff of AFST(I) and was suggested to continue this practice every year by allocating the budget.
- The financial support to organize various activities was approved.
- Appointment of an Accountant, which based on the performance will be regularized.
- Hon. Treasurer informed about Chapter share paid to those who have submitted audited report. Briefed about MUDA Site the committee informed that for higher dimension land, the extra amount will be paid during registration.

Website Committee: The major initiative was taken by website committee to have Portal for chapters online election, which was made under one organization one website initiative. The Demo Election conducted for chapter was successful and from the next year the chapters could make use of the same platform for election process. The Application Software (MIS) is ready and will be implemented from next year in AFST(I)-HQ office for chapter's LEC election.

Building Committee: MUDA was approached to provide an alternative site which was approved. In order to get the documents clear the services of the lawyer were procured. MUDA engineers have given the options of some alternative sites of which one site is approved. The difference in the amount for the additional site area needs to be paid before registration. The building committee has also discussed and approved to put up the fencing as soon as the site is registered. Further it also approved to go for conceptualization, design, valuations and construction of the AFSTI building in the new site at the earliest.

Awards Committee: The award committee met several times to scrutinize the received application for awards and consolidated the suggestions received from Experts Panel, and the finalized list was forwarded to CEC. The subcommittee evaluated the applications, nominations received for various awards of AFST(I) as per the guidelines. The committee submitted the scrutinized list to CEC which was approved by CEC in its meeting on 26.11.2022.

Technical Committee: It was decided to have a panel of experts take up the responsibility of giving inputs to various Regulatory Bodies on behalf of the AFST(I). The CEC has nominated one of the senior member of AFST(I) to International Association for Engineering and Food (IAEF). There was a request from FICSI, for Joining the GC of FICSI, AFST(I) nominated "President of AFST(I)" as the senior Professional.

Industrial & Government Relations Committee: The Industrial Relations Committee met during the year to discuss how to strengthen the industry – academia interaction based on discussion with a Industrial & Government relation committed, it was decided to conduct a workshop where both the academicians, industry and govt officials were invited for panel discussion. The workshop main objectives to discuss about the how to build a common platform for Industry Academia interaction.

Student Committee: The Student committee met several times during the year to discuss about student activities which would be carried during the year. The committee invited and briefed about food safety for various schools students were conducted a Workshop Program on Food Labeling and adulteration on account of World Food Safety Day 07.06.2022. Two day Online Training Programme on Statistical Methods in Food for the students and Research scholars on 10 and 11 Oct. 2022.

Appointment of Accountant for AFST(I) office: The Central Executive Committee (CEC) of AFST(I) met on 26.12.2022 is agreed to confirm the appointment based on evaluation of performance work of Mrs. Archana C N is found satisfactory during the probationary period at AFST(I), Mysuru as Accountant on regular basis from 1st December 2022.

- II. **E-Election:** Shri B Vasu was nominated as the Returning Officer for the current year's elections of AFST(I) based on his experience of conducting the online elections. The results of the election will be announced officially in the AGBM as per the notice of the Election & AGBM.
- III. The Kollam chapter requested to conduct the 29th ICFoST in Trivandrum and CEC has agreed unanimously. It is gratifying to note they were ready to shoulder the responsibility of organizing the 29th ICFoST.

IV. Annual Convention and other activities at Headquarters:

The CEC decided to organize 29th Indian Convention of Food Scientists & Technologists [ICFoST] in coordination with AFST(I) Kollam and Cochin Chapter, with support of CSIR-CFTRI Mysuru, DRDO-DFRL Mysuru and Musaliar College of Engineering, Trivandrum during 5-7th January 2023 at Thiruvananthpuram, Kerala on the Theme "Innovative Smart & Safe Solutions for Agro and marine food processing to achieve Sustainable Nutritional Security" 5s.

At the first instance, the Logo and theme contest for selection of logo for conference was arranged for Students and PhD Research Fellows both for members as well as non-members. The response was very good, and the expert team scrutinized the entries and selected a logo for adoption with the required modification. The winner will be invited for the conference and conferred with a suitable memento, certificate, and free registration for the Conference.

An exclusive website for ICFoST (www.icfost.org) is maintained for the registration of delegates with an abstract and poster submission portal. The 29thICFoST other highlight was National Stakeholder Conversation (NASCON) / Sustainability and start-up showcase (3 S) and Career Counseling.

The Chief Guest of the 29th ICFoST is Dr. C N Ravishankar, Director & Vice Chancellor, ICAR-Central Institute of Fisheries Education, ICAR, Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Govt. of India, Mumbai who will inaugurate the conference. Dr. Sridevi Annapurna Singh, Director, CSIR-CFTRI, Mysuru and Dr. Anil Dutt Semwal, Director, DRDO-DFRL, Mysuru, Sri. Vinod V R, IAS, Commissioner of Food Safety, Kerala and AFST(I) CEC members are the other distinguished guest. During inaugural, Dr. Sridevi Annapurna Singh, Director, CSIR-CFTRI, Mysuru will deliver Dr. B L Amla Memorial Lecture.

More than 950 participants have registered with about 38 speakers in 10 Technical Sessions during 3 days on various sub themes.

As a part of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahothsav, the curtain raiser for the 29th ICFoST at CSIR-CFTRI, Mysuru was held, on 17.07.2022 Prof. S Ayyappan, Chancellor, Central Agricultural University, Imphal and Chairman, Karnataka Science & Technology Academy, Bengaluru, Dr. Ravishankar C N, Director & Vice Chancellor, ICAR - Central Institute of Fisheries Education, (Indian Council of Agricultural Research, Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Govt. of India), Mumbai and Dr Alok K Srivastava President of AFST(I), Dr. N. Bhaskar, Advisor FSSAI and President Designated, AFST(I), Dr. Nandini P Shetty, Hon. Secretary of AFST(I) unveiled the logo of 29thICFoST In the seminar Prof. S Ayyappan and Dr. C N Ravishankar highlighted the importance of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahothsav and also about the theme of the Conference & mentioned this was the apt topic for 29th ICFoST.
